NEWS FROM AURORA CHRISTIAN ASSOCIATION, VULCAN, ROMANIA – September 2022

Look to Me, and be saved, all you ends of the earth! For I am God, and there is no other. Isaiah 45:22

What use is it, my brothers and sisters, if someone says he has faith, but he has no works? Can that faith save him? If a brother or sister is without clothing and in need of daily food, and one of you says to them, "Go in peace, be warmed and be filled," yet you do not give them what is necessary for *their* body, what use is that? In the same way, faith also, if it has no works, is dead, *being* by itself. James 2 v 14-17



The verses from James (above) have always been key verses for the works of God at Rora and in Romania. Both were founded on the basis of FAITH and LOVE, being outworked through practical means. Bread & Food Bags Project

In light of the verses above, giving bread and food to those in need is a small way ACA can show practical love. These projects are running very well, and really do meet a need for those who are unable to purchase essential food for their families. We pray for those who receive, that they would come to know the One who is '**The Bread of Life**'. We have recently been able to add some widows, who live up in the hills in Poiana Marului, to the list to receive regular food bags. The bags often consists of basic food stuffs such as rice, pasta, oil, stock cubes, tinned food etc.



This year we managed to have 2 Table Top Sales in the barn at Rora. Many visitors came to both and once again lots of tea, coffee and cake (of course!) consumed! As always people were generous with their giving (& buying!) and the total raised from both sales was just under £1000. This money will be used to support the Ukrainian families in the locality around Vulcan. The next sale is booked in the diary for Sat 3rd December.



Summer Camp

Nelu & Miki, along with helpers from the local churches in Vulcan, ran a children's camp on 25 - 28 July.

Miki writes: We had 28 children and 10 leaders with ages between 5-13. The theme for our camp was 'Masterchef': key ingredients that people in the Bible used, e.g. faith, obedience, patience. We also learned

about cuisines from different countries- France, Romania, Greece and America and what the secret to their cooking is: it could be obedience, moderation, etc. Each of them also cooked a desert corresponding to the cuisine they were studying.

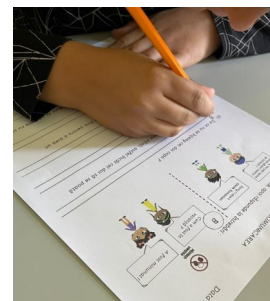


Kindergarten Groups

A grand opening was held on 30th April and the children (& parents) were amazed by the new, modern, clean environment, which will make learning a much more pleasant experience. ACA are so grateful for generous gifts received to purchase new furniture, including a new laptop and TV. We have also been able to renovate the room above Casa Betel where the younger kindergarten group meet.



During the year, the kindergarten teachers teach the children about various historical events and they celebrate some of them. This photo was taken on 'Heroes Day' which is a day to remember soldiers. The girls are wearing beautifully embroidered traditional Romanian dress.



We were also able to pass on a generous gift to the local school in Vulcan, to purchase a colour printer / copier. This will benefit all the children in the school, as the school books and work sheets are getting more expensive to purchase, and this will enable the school to copy the books and worksheets for the children.

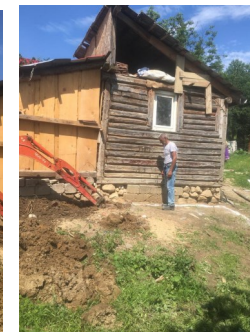
Irene writes:

In Romania children have to take all the resources they need for school. Children are provided with text books but they have to pay for workbooks. In the first few years I was here many children spent classes sat with nothing to do as their parents couldn't afford these workbooks. As a result many could not get the grades needed to pass the year and had to re-sit the year and because of this many children ended up leaving school without completing their education. So every September we (ACA) pay for workbooks for children from families that need this extra support. Today we went to give the money for 96 students. The hope is that this will help the children in their learning, and that they will desire to continue their education. We have definitely seen a reduction in the number of children having to repeat a year and drop out of school and there is a greater number of children going into higher education! Thank you to everyone who supports this amazing, essential project. Such a simple way to support a child's education and secure a brighter future for them.



The 3 building projects are progressing well, albeit slowly sometimes.

Merelina: The kitchen extension is now finished. The plan is to complete the building of the chimney and provide a wood stove before winter. We would also like to connect the house to the local water supply.



Mariana: This house just needs the finishing touches, plastering, painting and flooring.

Maria Corca: They have 'broken ground' and the foundations have been laid, so this build project is in the early stages.
